ROAD SAFETY WEEK IS COMING

National Road Safety Week (NRSW) is an annual initiative from the Safer Australian Roads and Highways Group, partnering road safety organisations and Government. The week highlights the impact of road trauma and ways to reduce it. This year it falls between the dates of 14 – 21 May.

Every year, approximately 1200 people are killed and another 44,000 are seriously injured on Australian roads. Traffic injury is the biggest killer of Australian children under 15 and the second-biggest killer of all Australians aged between 15 and 24. These numbers are growing every year but are preventable if we choose to Drive So Others Survive!



ROAD SAFETY WEEK CALENDAR Thursday 18 May

On Thursday the Shire have organised a road safety educational exercise with Wongan Hills District High School where our local first responders will be re-enacting a vehicle accident scenario to show students the importance of road safety.

Drive to Stay Alive Community Jive -Community event with the unveiling of a road safety bench which has been made to commemorate lives tragically lost on roads within our Shire. There will be a free BBQ lunch, bouncy castle, facepainting and the Apex train available.

EV CHARGING STATION GRANT AWARDED

In looking to a more sustainable future for our Shire, the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu has been successful in a grant application to install 2 electric vehicle charging stations in Wongan Hills. Each charging station will have the ability to charge 2 vehicles at once. One will be situated in the Wongan Hills CRC car park which will be available for public use. The second will be installed in the car park of the Shire Administration Office for charging of Shire vehicles and fleet. It is Councils intention to support the Federal Governments targets towards a sustainable future and in doing so, Council have approved its first electric vehicle purchase in the budget.
